## NOTICE OF BILL RETURNED TO RULES COMMITTEE

March 3, 2010

Mr. Speaker:

With committee review, the Education Committee has returned **H.B. 99**, BACKGROUND CHECKS FOR SCHOOL SPORTS OFFICIALS, by Representative L. Black, to the Rules Committee without recommendation with the following amendments:

- 1. Page 2, Lines 49 through 50:
  - 49 (b) A certifying entity shall require an official to submit to a criminal background
  - 50 <u>check before</u> { <u>July 1, 2010</u>} <u>the certifying entity schedules the official to</u> <u>officiate at a secondary-level interscholastic competition</u> .
- 2. Page 2, Lines 56 through 57:
  - 56 (b) consent to a fingerprint background check by the division that includes {-national and-}
  - 57 <u>regional criminal data files.</u>
- 3. Page 3, Lines 81 through 84:
  - 81 (11) If an applicant is denied certification as an official or an official is

    { dismissed } no longer scheduled as an
  - 82 <u>official because of information obtained through a criminal background check, the individual</u>
  - 83 <u>shall receive written notice of the reasons</u> { for denial or dismissal } and have an opportunity to
  - respond to the reasons under the procedures set forth in Subsection (10).
- 4. Page 4, Lines 91 through 97:







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- 91 (14) Notwithstanding Subsection (13), this section does not apply to:
- 92 (a) an unpaid volunteer individual officiating at a secondary-level interscholastic
- 93 <u>competition</u>; {-or-}
- 94 (b) an individual who officiates at a secondary-level interscholastic competition and {:
- 95 <u>(i)</u>} <u>is certified as an official from another state</u> {; and
- 96 (ii) accompanies an out-of-state school competing in the secondary-level
- 97 <u>interscholastic competition</u>} {<u>·</u>} <u>; or</u>

(c) an official who has not undergone a criminal background check who officiates at a secondary-level interscholastic competition, if a certifying entity would be forced to cancel the secondary-level interscholastic competition because the certifying entity is unable to schedule an official.

(15) An official described in Subsection (14)(c) may only officiate at a secondary-level interscholastic competition one time before submitting to a criminal background check as required in Subsection (2).
