Mr. President:

The Judiciary, Law Enforcement, and Criminal Justice Committee reports a favorable recommendation on **1st Sub. H.B. 234**, OPTING OUT OF THE REAL ID ACT, by Representative S. Sandstrom, with the following amendments:

- 1. Page 1, Lines 14 through 21:
 - prohibits the state from participating in the implementation of {-14 ► 15 **--**} the REAL ID Act of 2005; {-or **16** any national identification card system that may be enacted by the **United States** 17 Congress; } 18 ► prohibits the Driver License Division from implementing the provisions of {-**--**-} the REAL ID Act of 2005; {-or 19 20 any national identification card system that may be enacted by the **United States** 21 Congress; }
- 2. Page 1, Line 23 through Page 2, Line 26:







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- 3. Page 2, Lines 51 through 54:
 - 51 (3) (a) The state may not participate in the implementation of {
 - 52 (i) the REAL ID Act $\{: or \}$
 - 53 <u>(ii) any national identification card system that may be enacted by the United</u> <u>States</u>
 - 54 <u>Congress</u>} .
- 4. Page 2, Line 55 through Page 3, Line 64:
 - 55 (b) The division:
 - 56 (i) may not implement {
 - 57 (A) the provisions of the REAL ID Act {; or
 - 58 <u>(B) any national identification card system that may be enacted by the United</u> States
 - 59 <u>Congress</u>} ; and
 - 60 (ii) shall report to the governor any attempt by an agency or an agent of the United
 - 61 <u>States Department of Homeland Security to secure the implementation of</u> {
 - $62 \quad \underline{(A)} \quad \underline{(A)$
 - 63 (B) any national identification card system that may be enacted by the United States
 - 64 <u>Congress</u>} .
