H.B. 110 County Jail Inmate Medical Costs (Rep. B. Daw)

 <u>incarceration if the subsequent incarceration occurs within the same</u>

 <u>county and the incarceration is within three years of the date of the</u>

 <u>expense in behalf of the inmate</u>; or
 - placing a lien against the inmate's personal property {, to provide payment in the
 - 22 event funds become available at a later time \ held by the jail ;
 - 23 { provides that an existing lien may be carried over to a subsequent incarceration of
 - 24 the same inmate if the subsequent incarceration takes place within the county
 - 25 originating the lien and the future incarceration takes place within three years of the
 - 26 date the lien was placed against the prisoner's personal property; and
- 2. *Page 3, Lines 82 through 83:*
 - 82 (ii) placing a lien for the amount of the expense against the inmate's personal property {
 - 83 <u>to provide reimbursement in the event funds become available at a later</u> <u>time.</u>} <u>held by the jail.</u>
