53d ~~States citizens or lawfully present in the United States. ←Ë }~~ Subsection (2)(c)(i) does not apply to:

(A) an applicant that is a business entity licensed or regulated by a state or federal agency located within the United States;or

(B) the business entity applicant's officers, directors, or partners.

2. Page 8, Lines 230 through 230d

(2)(c)(i) does not apply to:

(A) an applicant that is a business entity licensed or regulated by a state or federal agency located within the United States; or

(B) the business entity applicant's officers, directors, or partners.
