Sen. Dayton introduced the bill.

3. <u>SB0044 Health Amendments for Legal Immigrant Children (L. Robles)</u>

Sen. Robles introduced the bill.

MOTION: Sen. Robles moved to adopt First Substitute S.B. 44, Health Amendments for Legal Immigrant Children, with the following amendment:

1. Page 2, Line 47:

47 <u>26-40-115.</u> Coverage for legal immigrant {-pregnant women and } children.

4. HB0088 Electronic Cigarette Restrictions (R. Menlove)

Rep. Menlove introduced the bill.

MOTION: Sen. Christensen moved to amend H.B. 88 as follows:

1. Page 2, Lines 36 through 37:

36 criminal penalties for violation of those prohibitions; <u>and</u>

37 {→ addresses advertising requirements relating to electronic cigarettes; and }

- Page 2, Line 54:
 54 {76-10-112, as enacted by Laws of Utah 1989, Chapter 193}
- 3. Page 15, Line 450 through Page 16, Line 466:
 - 450 { Section 10. Section 76-10-112 is amended to read:
 - 451 <u>76-10-112. Prohibition of distribution of electronic cigarettes, cigarettes, or</u> other
 - 452 tobacco products -- Exceptions.
 - 453 (1) Except as provided in Subsection (2), it is unlawful for a manufacturer, wholesaler,
 - 454 or retailer to give or distribute <u>electronic cigarettes</u>, <u>cigarettes</u>, <u>or other tobacco</u> products in this
 - 455 state without charge. Any person who violates this subsection is guilty of a class C
 - 456 misdemeanor for the first offense and a class B misdemeanor for any subsequent offense.
 - 457 (2) [Cigarettes] <u>Electronic cigarettes, cigarettes</u>, and other tobacco products may be
 - 458 distributed to adults without charge at professional conventions where the general public is
 - 459 excluded.
 - 460 (3) The prohibition described in Subsection (1) does not apply to [retailers,
 - 461 manufacturers, or distributors who give cigarettes or other tobacco products to persons of legal
 - 462 age upon their purchase of cigarettes or other tobacco products.] <u>a retailer</u>, <u>manufacturer, or</u>

 - 333 (iii) each month after { eight } ten weeks gestational age, up to 14 weeks gestational age.
