

**S.B. 66**

**PUBLIC SCHOOL EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES FOR HOME SCHOOL AND PRIVATE SCHOOL STUDENTS**

Senator **Mark B. Madsen** proposes the following amendments:

1. *Page 3, Lines 76 through 83:*
