LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill modifies the Transportation Code by amending provisions relating to highway construction contracts on class B or C roads.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

► requires the department to allow a local highway authority to be an additional contracting party for a federal-aid highway construction contract on a class B or C road along with the department in certain circumstances.

72-6-108.5, Utah Code Annotated 1953

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **72-6-108.5** is enacted to read:

72-6-108.5. Class B and C roads -- Federal-aid highway construction contract.

30b **under Subsection (1), the department may include the local highway authority as an additional**
30c **bondholder or obligee on the performance bond.**

30d **(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, the department shall have the final**
30e **authority to make decisions relating to a federal-aid highway construction contract on a class**
