30	(1) There is created the Homeless Coordinating Committee.
31	(2) (a) The committee shall consist of:
32	(i) the lieutenant governor or the lieutenant governor's designee;
33	(ii) the state planning coordinator[;] or the coordinator's designee;
34	(iii) the state superintendent of public instruction[7] or the superintendent's designee;
35	(iv) the chair of the board of trustees of the Utah Housing Corporation[,] or the chair's
36	designee; and
37	(v) the executive directors of the Department of Human Services, the Department of
38	Corrections, the Department of Community and Culture, the Department of Workforce
39	Services, and the Department of Health, or their designees.
40	(b) (i) The lieutenant governor shall [appoint] serve as the chair [from among these
41	members] of the committee.
42	(ii) The lieutenant governor may appoint a vice chair from among committee members.
43	who shall conduct committee meetings in the absence of the lieutenant governor.
44	(3) The governor may [also] appoint as members of the committee representatives of
45	local governments, local housing authorities, local law enforcement agencies, and of federal
46	and private agencies and organizations concerned with the homeless, mentally ill, elderly,
47	single-parent families, substance abusers, and persons with a disability.
48	(4) (a) Except as required by Subsection (4)(b), as terms of current committee members
49	expire, the governor shall appoint each new member or reappointed member to a four-year

51	(b) Notwithstanding the requirements of Subsection (4)(a), the governor shall, at the
52	time of appointment or reappointment, adjust the length of terms to ensure that the terms of
53	committee members are staggered so that approximately half of the committee is appointed
54	every two years.
55	(c) A person appointed under this Subsection (4) may not be appointed to serve more
56	than three consecutive terms.
57	(5) When a vacancy occurs in the membership for any reason, the replacement [shall
