Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
Section 1. Section 53A-1-410 is enacted to read:
<u>53A-1-410.</u> Definitions.
For purposes of Sections 53A-1-410 and 53A-1-411:
(1) "LEA compensation percentage" means the amount of money from an LEA's
general fund budgeted for front-line teachers, including benefits, divided by the LEA's total
general fund, excluding money budgeted for:
(a) capital outlay or debt service; and
(b) pupil transportation.
(2) "LEA percentage" means the average of an LEA's compensation percentage and the
LEA's front-line teacher percentage.
(3) "LEA front-line teacher percentage" means the number of full-time equivalent
front-line teachers in an LEA divided by the total number of full-time equivalent employees in
an LEA, excluding employees associated with pupil transportation.
(4) "Local education agency" or "LEA" means a school district or charter school.
(5) (a) "Front-line teacher" means a licensed teacher who has an assignment to teach a
kindergarten, elementary, secondary, or special education course.
(b) "Front-line teacher" does not include a prekindergarten teacher, a school-based
specialist, or a classroom aide.
(6) "Statewide compensation percentage" means the amount of money from all LEAs'
general funds budgeted for front-line teachers, including benefits, divided by all LEAs' total
general funds, excluding money budgeted for:
(a) capital outlay or debt service; and
(b) pupil transportation.
(7) "Statewide percentage" means the average of the statewide compensation
percentage and the statewide front-line teacher percentage.
(8) "Statewide front-line teacher percentage" means the number of full-time equivalent
front-line teachers in all LEAs divided by the total number of full-time equivalent employees in

61	(1) (a) An LEA shall report all information as required in this section for the possibility
62	of a future program to reward an LEA that has a relatively high or substantially improving
