 provides that lodging expenses are only paid to a legislator as a reimbursement for
actual expenses incurred by the legislator when attending an authorized legislative
meeting;
► limits lodging expense reimbursements to the federal per diem rates for Salt Lake
City;
 provides that transportation costs are only paid to a legislator as a reimbursement
for actual expenses incurred by the legislator for travel to and from an authorized
legislative meeting;
 requires transportation cost reimbursements to be based on the federal privately
owned vehicle mileage reimbursement rate or on the actual cost incurred for
commercial or public transportation;
 requires legislators to submit supporting documentation with each reimbursement
request;
 requires the Legislative Expenses Oversight Committee to ensure that procedures
