(3) (a) The program described in Subsection (2) shall provide a dual party relay system using third party intervention to connect a certified deaf or severely hearing or speech impaired person with a normal hearing person by way of telecommunication devices designed for that purpose.

- (b) The commission may, by rule, establish the type of telecommunications device to be provided to ensure functional equivalence.
- (4) (a) The commission shall impose a surcharge on each [residence and business access line of each customer to the local exchange of any telephone corporation providing such lines in this state] Ŝ→ [telephone number of each residential and business customer in this state] residential and business access line of each customer of local-exchange telephone service in this state, and each residential and business telephone number of each customer of mobile telephone service in this state ←Ŝ , Ĥ→ not including a telephone number used exclusively to transfer data to and from a mobile device, ←Ĥ

- (b) The commission shall establish by rule the amount to be charged under this section, [which may] provided that:

- (5) (a) [Any money] Money collected from the surcharge imposed under Subsection (4) shall be deposited in the state treasury as dedicated credits to be administered as determined by the [Public Service Commission] commission.
  - (b) These dedicated credits may be used only:
- (i) for the purchase, maintenance, repair, and distribution of telecommunication devices;
