Farnsworth for his pioneering work in the invention of the 14 television and for his many other inventions that have impacted the lives of millions 15 of people around the world. 16 **Special Clauses:** 17 None 18 19 Be it resolved by the Legislature of the state of Utah, the Governor concurring therein: 20 WHEREAS, few inventors have impacted the world as much as has Utah native Philo 21 T. Farnsworth; 22 WHEREAS, Philo T. Farnsworth has deep roots in Beaver, Utah, where he was born 23 August 19, 1906, in a log cabin $\hat{S} \rightarrow [and where his father had served as mayor in the 1880s] <math display="inline">\leftarrow \hat{S}$ ; 24 WHEREAS, when he was 12, Philo T. Farnsworth's family moved to a farm in Rigby, 25 Idaho, where he was fascinated by the electricity that powered his new home; 26 WHEREAS, Farnsworth was intrigued by mechanical and electrical technology and 27 managed to convert his mother's hand-powered washing machine to an electric-powered

61	WHEREAS, for many years after his death, Elma Farnsworth worked hard to help her
62	deceased husband retain his rightful place in history;
63	WHEREAS, crediting his wife's contribution to his life's work, Farnsworth once stated,
64	"My wife and I started this TV";
65	WHEREAS, in 1999, Time Magazine included Farnsworth in the "Time 100: The Most

66a	WHEREAS, the log cabin where Philo T.Farnsworth was born has been restored and

68	of Utah in the National Statuary Hall Collection in the United States Capitol, a second statue of
