 establishes requirements for a foreign-educated physician who has held a temporary
license for at least five years to apply for a permanent license;
 authorizes the division to revoke a license described in this bill for a material
misrepresentation or unlawful or unprofessional conduct; and
makes technical corrections.

	(1) As used in this section:
	(a) "Foreign country" means a country other than the United States, its territories, or
Can	aada.
	(b) "Foreign medical school" means a medical school that is outside the United States,
<u>its t</u>	erritories, and Canada.
	(2) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, an individual may receive a
type	e I foreign teaching license if the individual:
	(a) submits an application in a form prescribed by the division, which may include:
	(i) submission by the applicant of information maintained in a practitioner data bank,
as d	lesignated by division rule, with respect to the applicant;
	(ii) a record of professional liability claims made against the applicant and settlements

	(b) is a graduate of a foreign medical school that is accepted for certification by the
Edu	cational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates;

58	board, that the conduct has been corrected, monitored, and resolved; or
59	(iii) a mitigating circumstance exists that prevents resolution;
60	(e) submits documentation of legal status to work in the United States;
61	(f) meets at least three of the following qualifications:
62	(i) (A) published original results of clinical research, within 10 years before the day or
63	which the application is submitted, in a medical journal listed in the Index Medicus or an
64	equivalent scholarly publication; and
65	(B) submits the publication to the Board in English or in a foreign language with a
66	verifiable, certified English translation;
67	(ii) held an appointment at a medical school approved by the LCME or at any medical
68	school listed in the World Health Organization directory at the level of associate or full
69	professor, or its equivalent, for at least five years;
70	(iii) (A) developed a treatment modality, surgical technique, or other verified original
71	contribution to the field of medicine within 10 years before the day on which the application
72	was submitted; and
73	(B) has the treatment modality, surgical technique, or other verified original
74	contribution attested to by the dean of an LCME accredited school of medicine in Utah;
75	(iv) actively practiced medicine cumulatively for 10 years; or
76	(v) is a member in good standing of a board of the American Board of Medical
77	Specialities or equivalent specialty board;
78	(g) is of good moral character;
79	(h) is able to read, write, speak, understand, and be understood in the English language
80	and demonstrates proficiency to the satisfaction of the division in collaboration with the board
81	if requested;
82	(i) is invited by an LCME accredited medical school in Utah to serve as a full-time
83	member of the medical school's academic faculty, as evidenced by written certification from:
84	(i) the dean of the medical school, stating that the applicant has been appointed to a
85	full-time faculty position, that because the applicant has unique expertise in a specific field of
86	medicine the medical school considers the applicant to be a valuable member of the faculty,
87	and that the applicant is qualified by knowledge, skill, and ability to practice medicine in the

88	state; and
89	(ii) the head of the department to which the applicant is to be appointed, stating that the
90	applicant will be under the direction of the head of the department and will be permitted to
91	practice medicine only as a necessary part of the applicant's duties, providing detailed evidence
92	of the applicant's qualifications and competence, including the nature and location of the
93	applicant's proposed responsibilities, reasons for any limitations of the applicant's practice
94	responsibilities, and the degree of supervision, if any, under which the applicant will function;
95	(j) pays a licensing fee determined by the division under 63J-1-504; and
96	(k) has practiced medicine for at least 10 years as an attending physician.
97	(3) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, any individual may receive a
98	type II foreign teaching license if the individual:
99	(a) satisfies the requirements of Subsections 2(a) through (e) and (g) through (j); and
100	(b) has delivered clinical care to patients cumulatively for five years after gradation
101	from medical school.
102	(4) After an initial term of one year, a type I license may be renewed for periods of two
103	years if the licensee continues to satisfy the requirements described in Subsection (2) and
104	completes the division's continuing education renewal requirements established under Section
105	<u>58-67-303.</u>
106	(5) A type II license may be renewed on an annual basis, up to four times, if the
107	licensee continues to satisfy the requirements described in Subsection (3) and completes the
108	division's continuing education renewal requirements established under Section 58-67-303.
109	(6) A licence issued under this section:
110	(a) authorizes the licensee to practice medicine:
111	(i) within the scope of the licensee's employment at the medical school described in
112	Subsection (2)(i) and the licensee's academic position; and
113	(ii) at a hospital or clinic affiliated with the medical school described in Subsection
114	(2)(i) for the purpose of teaching, clinical care, or pursuing research;
115	(b) shall list the limitations described in Subsection (6)(a); and
116	(c) shall expire on the earlier of:
117	(i) one year after the day on which the type I or type II license is initially issued;
118	(ii) two years after the day on which the type I license was renewed; or

119	(iii) the day on which employment at the medical school described in Subsection (2)(i)
120	ends.
121	(7) A person who holds a type I license for five consecutive years may apply for
122	licensure as a physician and surgeon in this state and shall be licensed if the individual satisfies
123	the requirements described in Subsection (8). If the person fails to obtain licensure as a
124	physician and surgeon in this state, the person may apply for a renewal of the type I license
125	under Subsection (2).
126	(8) A person who holds a type I or type II license for five consecutive years is eligible
127	for licensure as a physician and surgeon in this state if the person:
128	(a) obtains certification from the Educational Commission for Foreign Medical
129	Graduates or any successor organization approved by the division in collaboration with the
130	board;
131	(b) obtains a passing score on the final step of the licensing examination sequence
132	required by division rule made in collaboration with the board; and
133	(c) satisfies the requirements described in Subsections 58-67-302(1)(a) through (c) and
134	(h) through (k).
135	(9) If a person who holds a type II license fails to obtain licensure as a physician and
136	surgeon in this state after applying under the procedures described in Subsection (8), the person
137	may not:
138	(a) reapply for or renew a type II license; or
139	(b) apply for a type I license.
140	(10) The division or the board may require an applicant for licensure under this section
141	to meet with the board and representatives of the division for the purpose of evaluating the
142	applicant's qualifications for licensure.
143	(11) The division in collaboration with the board may withdraw a license under this
144	section at any time for material misrepresentation or unlawful or unprofessional conduct.

146	58-67-303. Term of license Expiration Renewal.
147	(1) (a) [The] Except as provided in Section 58-67-302.7, the division shall issue each
148	license under this chapter in accordance with a two-year renewal cycle established by division
149	rule.

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150	(b) The division may by rule extend or shorten a renewal period by as much as one year
151	to stagger the renewal cycles it administers.
152	(2) At the time of renewal, the licensee shall show compliance with:
153	(a) continuing education renewal requirements; and
154	(b) the requirement for designation of a contact person and alternate contact person for
155	access to medical records and notice to patients as required by Subsections 58-67-304(1)(b)
156	and (c).
157	(3) Each license issued under this chapter expires on the expiration date shown on the
158	license unless renewed in accordance with Section 58-1-308.
159	Section 3. Section 58-67-502 is amended to read:
160	58-67-502. Unprofessional conduct.
161	"Unprofessional conduct" includes, in addition to the definition in Section 58-1-501,
162	using or employing the services of any individual to assist a licensee in any manner not in
163	accordance with the generally recognized practices, standards, or ethics of the profession, state
164	law, or division rule, or making a material misrepresentation regarding the qualifications for
165	licensure under Section 58-67-302.7.

STATE GOVERNMENT (UCA 36-12-13(2)(b))

Enactment of this legislation will result in revenue of \$500 in FY 2012 and \$1,000 in odd-numbered years therafter. Commerce Department expenses associated with the new licensure are estimated at \$400 in FY 2012 and \$500 annually thereafter. Commerce Service Fund revenue and expenditures affect the annual transfer to the General Fund. As such, this bill will result in transfers to the General Fund of \$100 in FY 2012 and \$500 in FY 2013 and every odd-numbered year after that. Transfers to the Genral Fund will decrease by \$500 in even-numbered years after FY 2013.
