LONG TITLE

7 **General Description:**

8 This bill creates an Intermountain Weatherization Training Fund to be administered by
9 the Division of Housing and Community Development within the Department of
10 Community and Culture.

12 **Highlighted Provisions:**

13 This bill:

- 14 ▶ creates the Intermountain Weatherization Training Fund;
- 15 ▶ provides for the fund to be administered by the director of the Division of Housing
16 and Community Development within the Department of Community and Culture;
- 17 ▶ identifies revenue sources for the fund;
- 18 ▶ provides that fund money shall be used to administer, operate, maintain, and support
19 the Intermountain Weatherization Training Center; and
- 20 ▶ provides for an annual accounting of fund money.

33 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

34 Section 1. Section **9-4-1701** is enacted to read:

35 **Part 17. Intermountain Weatherization Training Fund**

36 **9-4-1701. Creation and administration.**

37 (1) There is created an enterprise fund known as the "Intermountain Weatherization
38 Training Fund" administered by the director of the division or the director's designee.

39 (2) The division is the administrator of the fund.

40 (3) Revenues deposited in the fund shall consist of fees, donations, grants, gifts, or any
41 other money made available from any source that wants to support or use the Intermountain
42 Weatherization Training Center's facility or its staff.

43 (4) (a) The state treasurer shall invest the money in the fund according to the
44 procedures and requirements of Title 51, Chapter 7, State Money Management Act.

45 (b) All interest or other earnings derived from money in the fund shall be deposited in
46 the fund.

47 (5) The division may use fund money for administration of the fund not to exceed 10%
48 of the annual receipts to the fund.

49 Section 2. Section **9-4-1702** is enacted to read:

50 **9-4-1702. Distribution of fund money.**

51 (1) The director shall make the money in the fund available to administer, operate,
52 maintain, and support the Intermountain Weatherization Training Center in its efforts to assist
53 the citizens of Utah in energy conservation and lowering their utility bills.

54 (2) The director may, with the approval of the executive director of the department,
55 enact rules to establish procedures for the operation, administration, and maintenance of the
56 Intermountain Weatherization Training Center by following the procedures and requirements
57 of Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act.

58 Section 3. Section **9-4-1703** is enacted to read:

59 **9-4-1703. Annual accounting.**

60 (1) The director shall monitor the activities of the Intermountain Weatherization
61 Training Fund established under this part and those of the Intermountain Weatherization
62 Training Center to ensure compliance with the terms of this part.

63 (2) The director shall submit an annual report to the Legislature's Workforce Services
64 and Community and Economic Development Interim Committee before December 1 of each
65 year:

- 66 (a) accounting for expenditures made from the fund; and
- 67 (b) evaluating the effectiveness of the Intermountain Weatherization Training Center.
