issuing a request for proposals, analyzing responses, awarding a contract, and
evaluating results.

This resolution:
• requires that the determination to issue a request for proposals (RFP) for the
legislative branch is the responsibility of the Legislative Management Committee;
 provides that, upon approving the issuance of an RFP, the Legislative Management
Committee:
• shall assign the drafting of the RFP to the Office of Legislative Research and
General Counsel (OLRGC);
 may assign another staff office to work with the OLRGC;
• shall assign a person, committee, group of people, or staff office to review and
issue the RFP;
 may assign a committee, person, group of people, or staff office to review RFP
responses;
• shall assign a committee, person, group of people, or staff office to make a final
decision regarding award of the contract; and
• if the RFP is for an analysis, report, recommendation, or consultation, may

assign a committee, person, group of people, or staff office to review the analysis, report,	
recommendation, or consultation, determine whether the contractor fulfilled its obligations, and	
authorize payment to the contractor;

 provides that this rule does not apply to an RFP issued by a staff office to obtain a 	
good or service solely for a staff office.
