The Workforce Services and Community and Economic Development Committee reports a favorable recommendation on **S.C.R. 9**, PHILO T. FARNSWORTH CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, by Senator D. Stowell, with the following amendments:

- 1. *Page 1, Lines 22 through 23:*
 - WHEREAS, Philo T. Farnsworth has deep roots in Beaver, Utah, where he was born
 - 23 August 19, 1906, in a log cabin {-and where his father had served as mayor in the 1880s-};
- 2. *Page 3, Lines 65 through 70:*
 - WHEREAS, in 1999, Time Magazine included Farnsworth in the "Time 100: The Most
 - 66 Important People of the Century"; {-and-}

WHEREAS, the log cabin where Philo T. Farnsworth was born has been restored and can be visited by the public; and

- WHEREAS, a statue of Philo T. Farnsworth is one of two statues representing the state
- of Utah in the National Statuary Hall Collection in the United States Capitol, a second statue of
- 69 Farnsworth stands in the Utah State Capitol, and a third statue stands in his hometown of
- 70 Beaver:
