Rep. Pitcher called the meeting to order at 2:06 p.m.

MOTION: Rep..Brown moved to approve the minutes of the January 28, 2011 meeting. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Biskupski, Rep. Duckworth, Rep. Froerer, Rep Last, Rep. Morley, and Rep. Dunnigan absent for the vote.

H.B. 238 Radiologic Technologist and Radiology Practical Technician Licensing Act (Rep. D. Ipson)

MOTION: Rep. Gibson moved to amend H.B. 238 as follows:

 - 69 (2) "General supervision" means the supervising radiologist is available to provide immediate communication with the supervised person and is aware of the procedure before it is performed.

The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Biskupski, Rep. Duckworth, Rep. Last, Rep. Morley, and Rep. Dunnigan absent for the vote.

The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Last and Rep. Morley absent for the vote.

Rep. Ipson explained the bill to the committee assisted by Brian Adams, Utah Society of Radiology Physician Extenders, who distributed a handout. Ronald Ruff, M.D., Radiologist, spoke in favor of the bill; and Mark Steinagel, Department of Occupational and Professional Licensing, spoke to the bill.

MOTION: Rep. Webb moved to transmit H.B. 238 with a favorable recommendation. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. last absent for the vote.

H.B. 203 Codification of State Construction and Fire Codes (*Rep. M. Morley*)

MOTION: Rep. Dunnigan moved to amend H.B. 203 as follows:

- 1. Page 124, Line 3452 through Page 125, Line 3470:
 - 3452 <u>15A-5-303.</u> Amendments and additions to NFPA related to manufacture,
 - transportation, storage, and retail sales of fireworks.
 - (1) For purposes of this section and subject to Subsection (2), the Utah Fire

 Prevention Board shall adopt standards by rule for the retail sales of consumer

 fireworks, and in doing so, shall consider the applicable provisions of NFPA 1124,

 Chapter 7, Retail Sales of Consumer Fireworks.
 - (2) NFPA 1124 Manufacture, Transportation, Storage, and Retail Sales of Fireworks and
 - 3455 Pyrotechnic Articles:
 - 3456 {(1)} (a) In NFPA 1124, Chapter 7, Section 7.2, Special Limits for Retail Sales of Consumer
 - Fireworks, Subsection 7.2.8 is added as follows: "Display of Class C common state approved
 - 3458 explosives inside of buildings protected throughout with an automatic fire sprinkler system
 - 3459 <u>shall not exceed 25% of the area of the retail sales floor or exceed 600 square feet,</u> whichever is
 - 3460 <u>less."</u>
 - 3461 {-(2)} (b) In NFPA 1124, Chapter 7, Section 7.2, Special Limits for Retail Sales of Consumer
 - 3462 <u>Fireworks, Subsection 7.2.9 is added as follows: "Rack storage of Class C common state</u>
 - 3463 approved explosives inside of buildings is prohibited."
 - 3464 {-(3)-} (c) NFPA 1124, Chapter 7, Section 7.3.1, Exempt Amounts, Subsection 7.3.1.1, is
 - deleted and rewritten as follows: "Display of Class C common state approved explosives inside

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- of buildings not protected with an automatic fire sprinkler system shall not exceed 125 pounds
- 3467 of pyrotechnic composition."
- 3468 { (4) (d) NFPA 1124, Chapter 7, Section 7.3.15.2, Height of Sales
 Displays, Subsection
- 3469 7.3.15.2.2, is amended as follows: On line three delete "12 ft. (3.66m)" and replace it with "6
- 3470 <u>ft.".</u>

The motion passed with Rep. Wiley voting in opposition and Rep. Last absent for the vote.

MOTION: Rep. Dunnigan moved to further amend H.B. 203 as follows:

- 1. Page 2, Lines 30 through 31:
 - 30 Other Special Clauses:
 - This bill takes effect on July 1, 2011.

This bill coordinates with H.B. 260, Mechanics' Liens Revisions, to technically merge substantive amendments.

2. Page 6, Line 178:

178 58-56-21, as last amended by Laws of Utah 2010, Chapter 310

- 3. Page 213, Lines 6187 through 6188:
 - Section 131. Effective date.
 - This bill takes effect on July 1, 2011.

Section 132. Coordinating H.B. 203 with H.B. 260 -- Technically merging substantive amendments. If this H.B. 203, Codification of State Construction and Fire Codes, and H.B. 260, Mechanics' Liens Revisions, both pass, it is the intent of the Legislature that the Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel in preparing the Utah Code database for publication:

- (1) modify Subsection 15A-1-209(3)(b) to read:
- "(b) The standardized building permit form created under this Subsection (3) shall include fields for indicating the following information:
- (i) the name and address of the owner of the property on which the project will occur;
- (ii) the name and address of the contractor for the project;
- (iii) (A) the address of the project; or
- (B) a general description of the project;
- (iv) the county in which the property on which the project will occur is located;
- (v) the tax parcel identification number of the property; and
- (vi) whether the permit applicant is an original contractor or owner-builder."; and
- (2) change the citation in Subsection (3)(f)(ii) from "Subsection (3)(b)(iii)" to "Subsection (3)(b)(vi)."

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The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Last absent for the vote.

Rep. Morley explained the bill to the committee. Brent Halladay, Acting Utah State Fire Marshall, spoke in favor of the bill.

MOTION: Rep. Biskupski moved to transmit H.B. 203 with a favorable recommendation. The motion passed with Rep. Wiley voting in opposition and Rep. Last absent for the vote.

H.B. 47 Contract Cancellation Option on Purchase of Used Vehicle (Rep. J. Bird)

Rep. Bird explained the bill to the committee assisted by Melanie Briggs, West Jordan City Clerk, relating a personal experience. Craig Bickmore, New Car Dealers Association, and Wayne Jones, Independent Auto Dealers Association, spoke against the bill.

MOTION: Rep. Bird moved to transmit H.B. 47 with a favorable recommendation. The motion failed with Rep. Bird voting in favor.

H.B. 61 Home Business Workers' Compensation Amendments (*Rep. R. Barrus*)

MOTION: Rep. Morley moved to replace H.B. 61 with 1st Substitute H.B. 61. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Bird and Rep. Froerer absent for the vote.

Rep. Barrus explained the bill to the committee. Dennis Lloyd, Workers Compensation Fund, and Alan Hennebold, Utah Labor Commission, spoke to the bill. Tom Bingham, Utah Manufacturers Association, spoke against the bill.

MOTION: Rep. Last moved to adjourn. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Bird and Rep. Froerer absent for the vote.
