 <u>Section 13. Coordinating S.B. 224 with H.B. 143 -- Substantive and technical amendments.</u>
 <u>If this S.B. 224 and HB. 143, Ballot Placement Amendments, both pass, it is the intent of the Legislature that the Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel shall prepare the Utah Code database for publication by amending Subsection 20A-6-302(1)(c) to read:
 " [(b)] (c) the names of candidates [for the State Board of Education] are placed on the ballot [as certified by the lieutenant governor under Section 20A-14-105;] in the order specified under Section 20A-6-305."
