1. Approval of Minutes

MOTION: Sen. Davis moved to approve the minutes of February 10, 2011.

2. S.B. 82, Urban Farming Assessment Act

Sen. Neiderhauser introduced the bill. Max Burdick assisted with the presentation.

MOTION: Sen. Davis moved to Amend S.B. 82 as follows:

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0. Page 2, Line 45:
45 (a) [[-over 50% of]] the land to which the phrase applies is being devoted to active urban

The motion passed unanimously.

Jacki Evans, Research Director, Utah Taxpayers Association, spoke against the bill.

Spencer Mortensen, Private Citizen, spoke for the bill.

MOTION: Sen. Christensen moved to pass S.B. 82, out favorably, as amended.

The motion passed unanimously.

3. H.B. 88, Agriculture Sustainability Task Force

Rep. J. Drexler introduced the bill.

MOTION: Sen. Davis moved to pass H.B. 88, out favorably.

The motion passed unanimously.

4. 1st Sub. H.B. 51, School and Institutional Trust Lands

Rep. R. Barrus introduced the bill. Kevin Carter, Director, School and Institutional Trust Lands Association, assisted with the presentation.

MOTION: Sen. Davis moved to amend 1H.B.51 as follows:

- 0. Page 1, Lines 16 through 17:
 - exempts the Administration from fee agency provisions <u>for certain fees</u> in the Budgetary
 - 17 Procedures Act;
- 0. Page 7, Lines 182 through 183 House Committee Amendments 2-2-2011:

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- 182 (f) [[The]] (i) Except as provided in Subsection (3)(f)(ii), the administration is not subject to the fee agency requirements of Section
- 183 <u>63J-1-504.</u>

(ii) The following fees of the administration are subject to the requirements of Section 63J-1-504: application, assignment, amendment, affidavit for lost documents, name change, reinstatement, grazing non use, extension of time, partial conveyance, patent reissue, collateral assignment, electronic payment, and processing.

- 0. Page 29, Lines 865 through 866:
 - 865 (8) [[The]] (a) Except as provided in Subsection (8)(b), the School and Institutional Trust Lands Administration, established in 53C-1-201,
 - 866 <u>is exempt from the requirements of this section.</u>

(b) The following fees of the School and Institutional Trust Lands Administration are subject to the requirements of this section: application, assignment, amendment, affidavit for lost documents, name change, reinstatement, grazing non use, extension of time, partial conveyance, patent reissue, collateral assignment, electronic payment, and processing.

The motion passed unanimously.

MOTION: Sen. Christensen moved to move to the next item of business and reschedule 1H.B. 51, to be heard at a future meeting.

The motion passed unanimously.

5. H.J.R. 21, Selections of Unappropriated Federal Lands Joint Resolution

Rep. R. Barrus introduced the bill.

MOTION: Sen. Christensen moved to pass H.J.R. 21, out favorably.

The motion passed unanimously.

6. H.J.R. 19, Joint Resolution Opposing the Environmental Protection Agency's Regulation of Greenhouse Gases

Rep. R. Barrus introduced the bill.

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Mike Peterson, Utah Rural Electric Association, spoke in support of the bill.

Mark Ward, Policy Analyst, Utah Association of Counties, spoke in support of the bill.

MOTION: Sen. Hinkins moved to pass H.J.R. 19, out favorably.

The motion passed unanimously.
