59	Medicaid dental benefits to increase access to cost effective and quality dental health care by
60	increasing the number of dentists available for Medicaid dental services; and
61	(ii) target specific Medicaid populations or geographic areas in the state.
62	(b) The pilot program shall establish compensation models for dentists and dental
63	hygienists that:
64	(i) increase access to quality, cost effective dental care; and
65	(ii) use $\hat{H} \rightarrow [\frac{\text{the state's primary care grants}}]$ funds from the Division of Family Health
65a	and Preparedness that are available $\leftarrow \hat{\mathbf{H}}$ to reimburse dentists for educational loans in
66	exchange for the dentist agreeing to serve Medicaid and under-served populations.
67	(c) The division may amend the state plan and apply to the Secretary of Health and
68	Human Services for waivers or pilot programs if necessary to establish the new dental care
69	delivery and payment reform model. The division shall evaluate the pilot program's effect on
70	the cost of dental care and access to dental care for the targeted Medicaid populations. The
71	division shall report to the Legislature's Health and Human Services Interim Committee by
72	November 30th of each year that the pilot project is in effect.
