LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill appropriates money to the Department of Community and Culture for Fiscal Year 2013.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

▶ appropriates money to the Department of Community and Culture for an education and economic development support program for Fiscal Year 2013.

Money Appropriated in this Bill:

This bill appropriates:

▶ to the Department of Community and Culture, as a one-time appropriation:

• from the General Fund, ~~H→~~ ~~[\$1,000,000]~~ \$250,000 ~~←H~~, subject to intent language stating that the appropriation is non-lapsing and restricting the use of any non-lapsing funds to providing grants or funding to entities that provide education and encourage economic development through exhibits programs.

Other Special Clauses:

This bill takes effect on July 1, 2012.

This bill coordinates with H.B. 139, Department of Community and Culture Amendments by providing technical amendments.

H.B. 424



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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Appropriation.

Under the terms and conditions of Title 63J, Chapter 1, Budgetary Procedures Act, the following sums of money are appropriated from resources not otherwise appropriated, or reduced from amounts previously appropriated, out of the funds or accounts indicated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012 and ending June 30, 2013. These are additions to any amounts previously appropriated for fiscal year 2013.

To the Department of Community and Culture

From General Fund, one-time

H→ [\$1,000,000] \$250,000 ←H

Schedule of Programs:

Arts and Museums -- Museum Services

H→ [\$1,000,000] \$250,000 ←H

The Legislature intends that, under Section 63J-1-603 of the Utah Code, appropriations under this section not lapse at the close of fiscal year 2013. The use of any non-lapsing funds is limited to providing grants or funding to entities that provide education and encourage economic development through exhibits programs and events that feature Utah industry and innovation.

Section 2. Effective date.

This bill takes effect on July 1, 2012.

Section 3. Coordinating H.B. 424 with H.B. 139 -- Technical amendments.

If this H.B. 424 and H.B. 139, Department of Community and Culture Amendments, both pass and become law, the Legislature intends that the money be appropriated to the Department of Heritage and Arts.
