8	Committee Note:
9	The Education Interim Committee recommended this bill.
10	General Description:
11	This bill modifies the Utah Performance Assessment System for Students (U-PASS),
12	including requiring school districts and charter schools to administer computer adaptive
13	tests aligned with $\hat{S} \rightarrow [\text{the}] \underline{\text{Utah's}} \leftarrow \hat{S}$ common core.
14	Highlighted Provisions:
15	This bill:
16	 requires school districts and charter schools to administer computer adaptive tests
17	aligned with $\hat{S} \rightarrow [\text{the}] \underline{\text{Utah's}} \leftarrow \hat{S}$ common core beginning with the 2014-15 school year;
18	 eliminates an assessment system pilot program;
19	 requires the State Board of Education to make rules for:
20	• applying for and awarding money for computer adaptive tests;
21	• allocating money for computer adaptive tests to school districts and charter
22	schools who qualify for the money; and
23	• reporting the expenditure of money for computer adaptive tests; $\hat{S} \rightarrow [and]$
23a	requires the State Board of Education to establish a parent committee of 15
23b	members to review computer adaptive test questions appointed as follows:
23c	• 5 members appointed by the chair of the State Board of Education;
23d	• 5 members appointed by the speaker of the House of Representatives; and
23e	• 5 members appointed by the president of the Senate; and ←Ŝ

61	(a) require each school district and charter school to implement the Utah Performance
62	Assessment System for Students, hereafter referred to as U-PASS;
63	(b) require the state superintendent of public instruction to submit and recommend
64	criterion-referenced achievement tests or online computer adaptive tests, a tenth grade basic
65	skills competency test, an online writing assessment for grades 5 and 8, and a test for students
66	in grade 3 to measure reading grade level to the board for approval and adoption and
67	distribution to each school district and charter school by the state superintendent;
68	(c) develop an assessment method to uniformly measure statewide performance, school
69	district performance, and school performance of students in grades 3 through 12 in mastering
70	basic skills courses; and
71	(d) provide for the state to participate in the National Assessment of Educational
72	Progress state-by-state comparison testing program.

77	or online computer adaptive tests in grades 3 through 12 and courses in basic skill areas of the
78	core curriculum;
79	(b) an online writing assessment to all students in grades 5 and 8;
80	(c) a tenth grade basic skills competency test as detailed in Section 53A-1-611; and
81	(d) a test to all students in grade 3 to measure reading grade level.
82	(3) Beginning with the 2014-15 school year, the State Board of Education shall
83	annually require each school district and charter school, as applicable, to administer a computer
84	adaptive assessment system that is:
85	(a) adopted by the State Board of Education; and
86	(b) aligned to $\hat{S} \rightarrow [\underline{the}] \underline{Utah's} \leftarrow \hat{S} \underline{common core.}$

165	(1) The Legislature recognizes the need for the State Board of Education to develop
166	and implement standards and assessment processes to ensure that student progress is measured
167	and that school boards and school personnel are accountable.
168	(2) (a) In addition to its responsibilities under Sections 53A-1-603 through 53A-1-605,
169	the State Board of Education, through the state superintendent of public instruction, shall
