LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill amends the Criminal Code regarding the offense of aiding prostitution.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

► provides that a person's enabling another person to commit an act of aiding prostitution is also the offense of aiding prostitution.

76-10-1304, as last amended by Laws of Utah 1991, Chapter 107

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **76-10-1304** is amended to read:

76-10-1304. Aiding prostitution.

(1) A person is guilty of aiding prostitution if ~~[he]~~ the person:

(a) (i) solicits a person to patronize a prostitute;

~~[(b)]~~ (ii) procures or attempts to procure a prostitute for a patron; or

 35 (2) Aiding prostitution is a class B misdemeanor. However, a person who is convicted
 36 a second time, and on all subsequent convictions, under this section or under a local ordinance
 37 adopted in compliance with Section 76-10-1307 is guilty of a class A misdemeanor.
