This bill amends Title 63F, Chapter 1, Department of Technology Services, by establishing billing procedure <u>and dispute</u> requirements {for}relating to the Department of Technology Services (department) and requiring reporting relating to acquisitions from the department.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- defines the term "technology or service item";
- {prohibits the department from}<u>establishes a</u> billing {an executive branch agency for a}<u>and dispute process related to</u> technology or service {item using a process that automatically transfers money from the agency without prior executive branch agency approval for each separate bill}items provided by the department;

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- requires an executive branch agency, other than the department, to annually report to the legislative appropriations subcommittee that makes budget recommendations for the executive branch agency, regarding the technology or service items acquired by the executive branch agency from the department; and
- requires an executive branch agency to establish an information technology steering committee.

Section 1. Section 63F-1-901 is enacted to read:

Part 9. Miscellaneous Provisions

63F-1-901. Title.

This part is known as "Miscellaneous Provisions."

Section 2. Section 63F-1-902 is enacted to read:

63F-1-902. Definitions.

As used in this part, "technology or service item" means information technology,

equipment, and other items and services.

Section 3. Section 63F-1-903 is enacted to read:

63F-1-903. Billing by the department.

(1) The department {may not}shall bill an executive branch agency for a technology or service item using a process that {automatically transfers money from} permits the executive

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branch agency {without prior} to dispute the bill or a charge on the bill.

(2) The Division of Finance shall mediate a dispute described in Subsection (1) if an agreement cannot be reached between the department and the executive branch agency { approval for each separate bill}.

Section 4. Section 63F-1-904 is enacted to read:

<u>63F-1-904.</u> Annual report by executive branch agencies.

An executive branch agency, other than the department, shall annually report to the legislative appropriations subcommittee that makes budget recommendations for the executive branch agency, the following information:

(1) the technology or service items purchased by the executive branch agency, from the department, during the most recently completed fiscal year;

(2) the amount charged by the department for the technology or service items; and

(3) whether the department provided a positive or negative value to the executive branch agency for the technology or service items provided by the department.

Section 5. Section 63F-1-905 is enacted to read:

<u>63F-1-905.</u> Information technology steering committees.

(1) Each executive branch agency shall:

(a) establish an information technology steering committee consisting of employees of the executive branch agency; and

(b) provide an updated list of the members of the information technology steering committee to the department.

(2) An information technology steering committee described in Subsection (1) shall:

(a) assist the executive branch agency in developing an agency information technology plan described in Section 63F-1-204; { and }

(b) in providing the assistance described in Subsection (2)(a), consider the matters described in Subsection 63F-1-202(3) as they relate to the executive branch agency $\frac{1}{1-2}$; and

(c) after reviewing bills submitted to the executive branch agency by the department, provide an opinion to the executive branch agency regarding whether the department provided a positive or negative value to the executive branch agency for the technology or service items provided by the department.
