[If a {[school district] secondary student, or the secondary student's parent or guardian,} school district determines that {[}a{] the} secondary student's career and technical education goals are better achieved at a regional applied technology college A secondary student may attend a campus of the Utah College of Applied Technology created under Title 53B, Chapter 2a, Utah College of Applied Technology, [the student may attend that institution:] if the student's career and technical education goals are better achieved by attending the Utah College of Applied Technology as determined by:

- (1) the secondary student; and
- (2) if the secondary student is a minor, the secondary student's parent or legal guardian.

Section 2. Effective date.

This bill takes effect on July 1, 2012.
