LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill modifies the Public Safety Code regarding certification as a peace officer.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

► requires that an applicant for peace officer certification who requests a waiver of the peace officer training course must be able to lawfully possess a firearm, in addition to complying with the current waiver requirements.

53-6-206, as repealed and reenacted by Laws of Utah 2011, Chapter 58

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **53-6-206** is amended to read:

53-6-206. Waiver of training course requirement.

(1) The director may waive the required basic peace officer training course and certify an applicant who:



28 (a) provides proof that the applicant meets the requirements under Section 53-6-203
29 relating to qualifications for admission to the training course;

30 (b) provides proof that the applicant has completed a basic peace officer training
31 program that, in the director's judgment, is equivalent to the course required for certification
32 under this part;

33 (c) passes the certification examination; [~~and~~]

34 (d) passes a physical fitness test[-]; and

35 (e) is not restricted from possessing a firearm under Section 76-10-503 or federal law.

36 (2) A waiver applicant may not exercise peace officer authority until all waiver process
37 requirements have been met and the applicant has been certified.

38 (3) If an applicant fails the examination under Subsection (1)(c), the director may not
39 waive the required basic peace officer training course and the applicant shall comply with all of
40 the requirements in Subsection 53-6-205(1) to be certified as a peace officer in Utah.
