

Representative Kraig Powell proposes the following substitute bill:

CAREER AND TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION AMENDMENTS

2012 GENERAL SESSION

LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill modifies the Minimum School Program Act regarding funding for a secondary school student who attends a campus of the Utah College of Applied Technology.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ provides that, beginning with the 2011-12 school year, a secondary student who attends a campus of the Utah College of Applied Technology is counted in the average daily membership of the sending school district or charter school;

- ▶ provides that a secondary student may attend a campus of the Utah College of Applied Technology if:

- the student's school district or charter school has an agreement with the Utah College of Applied Technology; and

- the student's technical education goals would be better achieved by attending the Utah College of Applied Technology as determined by the student's parent and, if the secondary student is a minor, the secondary student's parent or guardian;

and

- ▶ makes technical amendments.

28 This bill provides retrospective operation to July 1, 2011.

29 This bill coordinates with H.B. 206, Curriculum Options for Secondary School
30 Students, by providing superseding technical and substantive amendments.

37 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

38 Section 1. Section **53A-17a-114** is amended to read:

39 **53A-17a-114. Career and technical education program alternatives.**

40 ~~[If a school district determines that a secondary student's career and technical education~~
41 ~~goals are better achieved at a regional applied technology college]~~

42 (1) A secondary student may attend a campus of the Utah College of Applied
43 Technology created under Title 53B, Chapter 2a, Utah College of Applied Technology, [the
44 student may attend that institution.] if:

45 (a) the secondary student's school district or charter school has an agreement or
46 memorandum of understanding with the Utah College of Applied Technology; and

47 (b) the secondary student's career and technical education goals are better achieved by
48 attending the Utah College of Applied Technology as determined by:

49 (i) the secondary student; and

50 (ii) if the secondary student is a minor, the secondary student's parent or legal guardian.

51 (2) Beginning with the school year that begins July 1, 2011 and ends on June 30, 2012,
52 a secondary student served under this section in a campus of the Utah College of Applied
53 Technology shall continue to be counted in the average daily membership of the sending school
54 district or charter school.

55 Section 2. **Retrospective operation.**

56 This bill provides retrospective operation to July 1, 2011.

57 Section 3. **Coordinating H.B. 258 with H.B. 206 -- Superseding technical and**
58 **substantive amendments.**

59 If this H.B. 258 and H.B. 206, Curriculum Options for Secondary School Students, both
60 pass and become law, the Legislature intends that the amendments to Section 53A-17a-114 in
61 this bill supersede the amendments to Section 53A-17a-114 in H.B. 206 and that the Office of
62 Legislative Research and General Counsel make these changes in preparing the Utah Code
63 database for publication.
