36	WHEREAS, in a state where funds for education are limited and classes are large,
37	parental engagement serves to assist teachers and school personnel with resources and
38	expertise in the arts, science, and technology, and reduces the need for more paid personnel;
39	WHEREAS, Utah Code Section 53A-13-109 states that "the primary responsibility for
40	the education of children within the state resides with their parents or guardians and that the
41	role of state and local governments is to support and assist parents in fulfilling that
42	responsibility";
43	WHEREAS, Utah Code Section 53A-1a-105 states that "The Legislature recognizes the
44	importance of parental participation in the educational process in order for students to achieve
45	and maintain high levels of performance"; and
46	WHEREAS, the Utah Legislature recognizes that parental engagement is key to
47	academic achievement and the importance of parent/community/school partnerships:
48	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of the state of Utah, the
49	Governor concurring therein, recognizes the parents and family members of students in Utah
50	schools for their efforts to foster the education of their children by nurturing them, monitoring
51	their progress, and volunteering time in their schools.
52	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature and the Governor express support
53	for policies of the Utah State Office of Education, and its constituent districts, unit schools, and
54	charter schools, that provide parents with opportunities to be actively involved in their
55	children's education.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature and the Governor recognize the
efforts of school districts, schools, teachers, and their parent associations and organizations to
create an environment conducive to parental engagement and to encourage family engagement
