General Description:

This bill amends the Utah Controlled Substances Act and the {Utah Health Code}Controlled Substance Database Act.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- prohibits the Department of Health from requiring a health care provider to complete more than 1/2 hour of education per licensing period on the appropriate management of chronic pain;
- provides that the education counts toward continuing professional education on controlled substances prescribing;
- amends the effective date for controlled substances prescriber education requirements;

- exempts optometrists and naturopathic physicians from controlled substances
 prescriber education requirements;
- <u>provides that completing the controlled substance database online tutorial and online test counts as 1/2 hour of continuing professional education on controlled substances prescribing; and</u>
- makes technical changes.

Section 1. Section $\{26-1-3\}$ 58-37-6.5 is amended to read:

26-1-36. Duty to establish program to reduce deaths and other harm from prescription opiates used for chronic noncancer pain.

(1) As used in this section, "opiate" means any drug or other substance having an addiction-forming or addiction-sustaining liability similar to morphine or being capable of conversion into a drug having addiction-forming or addiction-sustaining liability.

(2) (a) In addition to the duties listed in Section 26-1-30, the department shall develop and implement a two-year program in coordination with the Division of Professional Licensing, the Utah Labor Commission, and the Utah attorney general, to:

[(a)] (i) investigate the causes of and risk factors for death and nonfatal complications of prescription opiate use and misuse in Utah for chronic pain by utilizing the Utah Controlled Substance Database created in Section 58-37f-201;

[(b)] (ii) study the risks, warning signs, and solutions to the risks associated with prescription opiate medications for chronic pain, including risks and prevention of misuse and

diversion of those medications; [(c)] (iii) provide education to health care providers, patients, insurers, and the general public on the appropriate management of chronic pain, including the effective use of medical treatment and quality care guidelines that are scientifically based and peer reviewed; and [(d)] (iv) educate the public regarding: - [(i)] (A) the purpose of the Controlled Substance Database established in Section 58-37f-201; and [(ii)] (B) the requirement that a person's name and prescription information be recorded on the database when the person fills a prescription for a schedule II, III, IV, or V controlled substance. (b) (i) The program developed under Subsection (2)(a) may not require health care providers to complete more than 1/2 hour of continuing professional education each licensing period to satisfy Subsection (2)(a)(iii); (ii) Continuing professional education satisfying Subsection (2)(a)(iii) shall count toward the continuing professional education required under Section 58-37-6.5. (3) The department shall report on the development and implementation of the program required in Subsection (2) to the legislative Health and Human Services Interim Committee and the legislative Business and Labor Interim Committee no later than the November interim meetings in 2008 and 2009. - (1) (a) (i) [Beginning on July 1, 2012, each] Except as provided in Subsection (1)(a)(ii), beginning January 1, 2013, an individual[, other than a veterinarian,] who has a license to prescribe a controlled substance under Title 58, Chapter 37, Utah Controlled Substances Act, shall complete at least four continuing professional education hours in approved controlled substance prescribing classes per licensing period.
 - (ii) Subsection (1)(a)(i) does not apply to:
 - (A) an optometrist licensed under Title 58, Chapter 16a, Utah Optometry Practice Act;
 - (B) a veterinarian licensed under Title 58, Chapter 28, Veterinary Practice Act; or
- (C) a naturopathic physician licensed under Title 58, Chapter 71, Naturopathic Physician Practice Act.
 - (b) [Any] A controlled substance prescribing class under this section shall:
- (i) qualify for the [AMA PRA] American Medical Association Physician's Recognition Award Category 1 Credit;

- <u>58-37f-402.</u> Online tutorial and test relating to the database -- Fees -- Rulemaking authority -- Continuing professional education credit.
- (1) The division shall develop an online tutorial and an online test for registration to use the database that provides instruction regarding, and tests, the following:
 - (a) the purpose of the database;
 - (b) how to access and use the database;
 - (c) the law relating to:
 - (i) the use of the database; and
 - (ii) the information submitted to, and obtained from, the database; and
- (d) basic knowledge that is important for all people who prescribe controlled substances to know in order to help ensure the health and safety of an individual to whom a controlled substance is prescribed.
 - (2) The division shall design the test described in this section as follows:
 - (a) an individual shall answer all of the questions correctly in order to pass the test;
- (b) an individual shall be permitted to immediately retake the portion of the test that the individual answers incorrectly as many times as necessary for the individual to pass the test; and
 - (c) after an individual takes the test, the test software shall:
- (i) immediately inform the individual of the number of questions that were answered incorrectly;
 - (ii) provide the correct answers;
- (iii) replay the portion of the tutorial that relates to the incorrectly answered questions; and
 - (iv) ask the individual the incorrectly answered questions again.
- (3) The division shall design the tutorial and test so that it is possible to take the tutorial and complete the test in 20 minutes or less, if the individual answers all of the questions correctly on the first attempt.
- (4) The division shall ensure that the tutorial and test described in this section are fully functional and available for use online on or before November 1, 2010.
 - (5) The division shall impose a fee, in accordance with Section 63J-1-504, on an

<u>individual</u> who takes the test described in this section, to pay the costs incurred by the division <u>to:</u>
