8	General Description:
9	This bill amends the exemptions from licensure in the Pharmacy Practice Act.
10	Highlighted Provisions:
11	This bill:
12	 defines a cancer drug treatment regimen;
13	 exempts an oncologist from the Pharmacy Practice Act when the oncologist
14	provides a cancer drug treatment regime to a patient;
15	 excludes Schedule I, II, and III drugs from the drugs an oncologist may provide to a
16	patient under the exemption from the Pharmacy Practice Act; and
17	 includes assistants to the oncologist who are under the general supervision of the
18	oncologist in the exemption from the Pharmacy Practice Act.

28	Section 1. Section 58-17b-309 is amended to read:
29	58-17b-309. Exemptions from licensure.
30	(1) For purposes of this section:
31	(a) "Cancer drug treatment regimen":
32	(i) means a prescription drug used to treat cancer, manage its symptoms, or provide
33	continuity of care for a cancer patient;
34	(ii) includes:
35	(A) a chemotherapy drug administered intravenously, orally, rectally, or by dermal
36	methods; and
37	(B) a drug used to support cancer treatment, including to treat, alleviate, or minimize
38	physical and psychological symptoms or pain, or to improve patient tolerance of cancer
39	treatments or prepare a patient for a subsequent course of therapy; and
40	(iii) does not mean a drug listed under federal law as a Schedule I, II, or III drug.
41	[(a)] <u>(b)</u> "Cosmetic drug":
42	(i) means a prescription drug that is:
43	(A) for the purpose of promoting attractiveness or altering the appearance of an
44	individual; and
45	(B) listed as a cosmetic drug subject to the exemption under this section by the division
46	by administrative rule; and
47	(ii) does not include a prescription drug that is:
48	(A) a controlled substance;
49	(B) compounded by the physician; or
50	(C) prescribed or used for the patient for the purpose of diagnosing, curing, mitigating,
51	treating, or preventing a disease.
52	[(b)] (c) "Injectable weight loss drug":
53	(i) means an injectable prescription drug:

64	(2) In addition to the exemptions from licensure in Section 58-1-307, the following
65	individuals may engage in the acts or practices described in this section without being licensed
66	under this chapter:
67	(a) a person selling or providing contact lenses in accordance with Section 58-16a-801;
68	(b) an individual engaging in the practice of pharmacy technician under the direct
69	personal supervision of a pharmacist while making satisfactory progress in an approved
70	program as defined in division rule;
71	(c) a prescribing practitioner who prescribes and dispenses a cosmetic drug or an

74	(d) an optometrist, as defined in Section 58-16a-102, acting within the optometrist's
75	scope of practice as defined in Section 58-16a-601, who prescribes and dispenses a cosmetic
76	drug to the optometrist's patient in accordance with Subsection (4)[-]; and
77	(e) (i) a prescribing practitioner who:
78	(A) treats patients in an outpatient clinic setting;
79	(B) provides a cancer drug treatment regimen to a patient;
80	(C) is certified or eligible to be certified by the American Board of Internal Medicine in
81	medical oncology; and
82	(D) follows labeling, recordkeeping, patient counseling, and storage requirements
83	established by administrative rule adopted by the division in consultation with the board; and
84	(ii) a person who is not a prescribing practitioner who is:
85	(A) employed by the prescribing practitioner or the outpatient clinic setting in which
86	the prescribing practitioner works;
87	(B) acting under the general supervision of the prescribing practitioner; and
88	(C) follows Subsection (2)(e)(i)(D).
89	(3) In accordance with Subsection 58-1-303(1)(a), an individual exempt under

Subsection (2)(b) must take all examinations as required by division rule following completion of an approved curriculum of education, within the required time frame. This exemption expires immediately upon notification of a failing score of an examination, and the individual may not continue working as a pharmacy technician even under direct supervision.

- (4) A prescribing practitioner or optometrist is exempt from licensing under the provisions of this part if the prescribing practitioner or optometrist:
- (a) (i) writes a prescription for a drug the prescribing practitioner or optometrist has the authority to dispense under Subsection (4)(b); and
 - (ii) informs the patient:

- (A) that the prescription may be filled at a pharmacy or dispensed in the prescribing practitioner's or optometrist's office;
 - (B) of the directions for appropriate use of the drug;
 - (C) of potential side-effects to the use of the drug; and
- (D) how to contact the prescribing practitioner or optometrist if the patient has questions or concerns regarding the drug;
 - (b) dispenses a cosmetic drug or injectable weight loss drug only to the prescribing practitioner's patients or for an optometrist, dispenses a cosmetic drug only to the optometrist's patients; and
 - (c) follows labeling, record keeping, patient counseling, and storage requirements established by administrative rule adopted by the division in consultation with the boards listed in Subsection (5)(a).
 - (5) (a) The division, in consultation with the board under this chapter, the Physician Licensing Board, the Osteopathic Physician Licensing Board, the Physician Assistant Licensing Board, the Board of Nursing, and the Optometrist Licensing Board shall adopt administrative rules pursuant to Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act to designate:
 - (i) the prescription drugs that may be dispensed as a cosmetic drug or weight loss drug under this section; and
 - (ii) the requirements under Subsection (4)(c).
 - (b) When making a determination under Subsection (1)[(a)](b), the division and boards listed in Subsection (5)(a), may consider any federal Food and Drug Administration indications or approval associated with a drug when adopting a rule to designate a prescription drug that

may be dispensed under this se	section.
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- (c) The division may inspect the office of a prescribing practitioner or optometrist who is dispensing under the provisions of this section, in order to determine whether the prescribing practitioner or optometrist is in compliance with the provisions of this section. If a prescribing practitioner or optometrist chooses to dispense under the provisions of this section, the prescribing practitioner or optometrist consents to the jurisdiction of the division to inspect the prescribing practitioner's or optometrist's office and determine if the provisions of this section are being met by the prescribing practitioner and optometrist.
- (d) If a prescribing practitioner or optometrist violates a provision of this section, the prescribing practitioner or optometrist may be subject to discipline under:
 - (i) this chapter; and
- (ii) (A) Chapter 16a, Utah Optometry Practice Act;
- 133 (B) Chapter 31b, Nurse Practice Act;
- 134 (C) Chapter 67, Utah Medical Practice Act;
 - (D) Chapter 68, Utah Osteopathic Medical Practice Act; or
- (E) Chapter 70a, Physician Assistant Act.
 - (6) Except as provided in Subsection (2)(d), this section does not restrict or limit the scope of practice of an optometrist or optometric physician licensed under Chapter 16a, Utah Optometry Practice Act.
