8	LONG TITLE
9	General Description:
10	This joint resolution of the Legislature proposes to amend the Utah Constitution to
11	modify requirements for increasing a state tax or fee.
12	Highlighted Provisions:
13	This resolution proposes to amend the Utah Constitution to:
14	require a two-thirds vote of the Legislature when enacting any tax increase or any
15	fee increase that exceeds the cost of providing a service.
16	Special Clauses:
17	This resolution directs the lieutenant governor to submit this proposal to voters.
18	This resolution provides a contingent effective date of January 1, 2013, for this
19	proposal.
20	<b>Utah Constitution Sections Affected:</b>
21	AMENDS:
22	ARTICLE VI, SECTION 22
<ul><li>23</li><li>24</li></ul>	Be it resolved by the Legislature of the state of Utah, two-thirds of all members elected to each
25	of the two houses voting in favor thereof:
26	Section 1. It is proposed to amend Utah Constitution Article VI, Section 22, to read:

Article VI, Section 22. [Reading of bills -- Bill to contain only one subject -- Bills

29	(1) Every bill shall be read by title three separate times in each house except in cases
30	where two-thirds of the house where such bill is pending suspend this requirement.
31	(2) Except general appropriation bills and bills for the codification and general revision
32	of laws, no bill shall be passed containing more than one subject, which shall be clearly
33	expressed in its title.
34	(3) The vote upon the final passage of all bills shall be by yeas and nays and entered
35	upon the respective journals of the house in which the vote occurs.
36	(4) No bill or joint resolution shall be passed except with the assent of the majority of
37	all the members elected to each house of the Legislature[-], except that the assent of two-thirds
38	of all members elected to each house is required for any bill that provides for:
39	(a) a tax increase; or
40	(b) a fee increase if the increased fee will generate revenue exceeding the actual cost of
41	providing the service for which the fee is charged.
<b>1</b> 2	Section 2. Submittal to voters.
43	The lieutenant governor is directed to submit this proposed amendment to the voters of
14	the state at the next regular general election in the manner provided by law.
45	Section 3. Effective date.
46	If the amendment proposed by this joint resolution is approved by a majority of those
<b>1</b> 7	voting on it at the next regular general election, the amendment shall take effect on January 1,
48	<u>2013.</u>
