Madam Speaker:

The House Rules Committee recommends, with written request of the sponsor, that H.B. 102, Blasting Regulations *(Rep. R. Edwards)* be amended as follows and further recommends it be assigned to the House Natural Resources, Agriculture & Environment Standing Committee:

- 1. Page 1, Lines 8 through 10:
 - 8 General Description:
 - 9 This bill provides for the regulation of explosives use by a mining operation that blasts
 - 10 within {-one-} <u>one-half</u> mile of a residential structure.

2. Page 1, Lines 11 through 19:

- 11 Highlighted Provisions:
- 12 This bill:
- 13 ► requires a mining operation that blasts within {-one-} <u>one-half</u> mile of a residential structure to
- 14 comply with local, state, and federal law;
- 15 grants rulemaking authority to the Board of Oil, Gas, and Mining to regulate a
- 16 mining operation that blasts within {-one-} <u>one-half</u> mile of a residential structure; and
- 17 grants rulemaking authority to the Board of Oil, Gas, and Mining to make rules,
 {in
- 18 order to prevent injury or damage, that impose further, specific limitations on a-} <u>for a</u>
- 19 blasting mining operation that blasts within {-one-} <u>one-half</u> mile of a residential structure {--} <u>, that address certain considerations.</u>
- 3. Page 2, Lines 31 through 32:
 - 31 (1) A mining operation that uses explosives within { one-} one-half mile of a residential structure

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- 32 <u>may only use explosives in accordance with local, state, and federal law.</u>
- 4. Page 2, Lines 33 through 44:
 - 33 (2) The board shall, in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative
 - 34 <u>Rulemaking Act, make rules that regulate a mining operation's use of explosives within</u>
 <u>one-half</u>
 - 35 <u>mile of a residential structure, including rules that require a mining operation to:</u>
 - 36 (a) provide notice of upcoming blasting:
 - 37 (i) generally to the local public; and
 - 38 (ii) specifically to residents living within { one } one-half mile of the proposed blasting site;
 - 39 (b) maintain a blasting record;
 - 40 (c) mitigate explosives use to meet industry-standard vibration limits;
 - 41 (d) monitor air blasts and ground vibration to ensure operation within industry-standard
 - 42 <u>limits; and</u>
 - 43 (e) upon request of a person who lives in or owns a structure within {-1/2} <u>one-half</u> mile of the
 - 44 <u>mining operation, conduct a preblasting survey of that structure.</u>
- 5. Page 2, Lines 45 through 50:
 - 45 (3) {In order to prevent injury or damage caused by a mining operation's use of
 - 46 <u>explosives within one mile of a residential structure, the</u> <u>The</u> board may, in <u>accordance with Title</u>
 - 47 <u>63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, make rules that</u>
 <u>limit</u> <u>address, for a mining operation that uses explosives within one-half</u>
 mile of a residential structure <u>i</u>
 - 48 (a) the type of explosives or detonating equipment used by a mining operation:
 - 49 (b) the size or timing of blasting at a mining operation; or
 - 50 (c) the frequency, in inches per second, of blast vibrations at a mining operation.
