H.B. 213 School Community Council Member Qualifications (Rep. L. Perry)

Rep. Wright moved to amend the bill as follows:

- 1. Page 1, Line 15:
 - 5 council; {-and-}
 - <u>requires the membership of a school community council to include two or more parent or guardian members than the number of school employee members; and </u>
- 2. *Page 3, Lines 64 through 74:*
 - (b) Except as provided in Subsection (4)(c):
 - (i) each school community council for a high school shall have six parent or guardian
 - 66 members and { five } four school employee members, including the principal; and

- 67 (ii) each school community council for a school other than a high school shall have
- 68 four parent or guardian members and {three} two school employee members, including the principal.
- 69 (c) (i) A school community council may have a larger membership provided that the
- 70 { membership include two or more parent or guardian members { exceeds } than the number of school employee members.
- 71 (ii) A school community council <u>for a high school</u> may have a smaller membership provided that:
- 72 (A) the { <u>number of</u> } <u>membership include two or more</u> parent or guardian members { <u>exceeds</u> } <u>than the</u> the number of school employee
- 73 members; and
- 74 (B) there are at least two school employee members on the school community council.
