that it be referred to the Constitutional Revision Commission for study. The motion

passed unanimously.

S.B. 16 Ballot Proposition Amendments (Sen. S. Jenkins)

S.B. 17 Candidate Vacancy Amendments (Sen. P. Knudson)

Page 3, Line 86: After "email address;" insert "or"
After line 86, insert "(iv) birth date;"
