### H.B. 51 Medical Speciality Practice Act Amendments (*Rep. E. Vickers*)

Vice Chair Vickers presented the bill to the committee.

- **MOTION:** Rep. Menlove moved to amend 1st Substitute H.B. 46 as follows:
  - 1. Page 1, Lines 9 through 10:
    - 9 This bill facilitates the enrollment of Medicaid beneficiaries, {-Children-} Children's Health Insurance Program
    - 10 enrollees, and {-public-} <u>state</u> employees <u>and their dependents</u> into the electronic exchange of clinical health records.
  - 2. Page 1, Lines 18 through 19:
    - 18 amends the duties of the Public Employees Health Program to enroll
       {<u>members</u>} <u>state employees and their dependents</u> in
    - 19 the electronic exchange of clinical health records unless the individual opts out.

### 3. Page 8, Line 242 through Page 9, Line 243:

- 242 <u>(t) require</u> {<u>a member</u>} <u>state employees and their dependents</u> to participate in the electronic exchange of clinical health records
- 243 in accordance with Section 26-1-37 unless the enrollee opts out of participation.
