H.B. 337 Open Government Amendments (Rep. J. Dougall)

Section 7. Section 63G-2-1005 is enacted to read:
63G-2-1005. Limitations on posting.
Notwithstanding any provision of this part, or rules made under this part, a
government entity is not required to, and may not be required to:
(1) redact restricted information from a record in order to require the record to be, or
make the record eligible to be, posted on the website; or
(2) post a record on the website that contains restricted information.
