34	(2) "Climate change" means an observed rise in average annual temperature that:
35	(a) is attributed directly or indirectly to human activity that alters the composition of
36	the global atmosphere;
37	(b) occurs in addition to natural climate variability observed over comparable time
38	periods; and
39	(c) poses risks to fire management, including:
40	(i) an extended fire season;
41	(ii) an increase in fire occurrence; and
42	(iii) an increase in area burned.
43	[(2)] (3) "Division" means the Division of Forestry, Fire, and State Lands.
44	[(3)] (4) "Multiple use" means the management of various surface and subsurface
45	resources in a manner that will best meet the present and future needs of the people of this
46	state.
47	[(4)] (5) "Public trust assets" means those lands and resources, including sovereign
48	lands, administered by the division.
49	[(5)] (6) "Sovereign lands" means those lands lying below the ordinary high water
50	mark of navigable bodies of water at the date of statehood and owned by the state by virtue of

52	[(6)] (7) "State lands" means all lands administered by the division.
53	[(7)] (8) "Sustained yield" means the achievement and maintenance of high level
54	annual or periodic output of the various renewable resources of land without impairment of the

64	65A-8-101. Division responsibilities for fire control and the preservation of
65	forest, watershed, and other lands Reciprocal agreements for fire protection.
66	(1) The division shall determine and execute the best method for protecting private and
67	public property by:
68	(a) except as provided by Subsection (1)(e), preventing the origin and spread of fire on
69	nonfederal forest, range, or watershed land in an unincorporated area of the state;
70	(b) protecting a nonfederal forest or watershed area using conservation principles;
71	(c) encouraging a private landowner to preserve, protect, and manage forest or other
72	land throughout the state;
73	(d) taking action the division considers appropriate to control wildland fire and protect
74	life and property on the nonfederal forest, range, or watershed land within an unincorporated
75	area of the state; and
76	(e) implementing a limited fire suppression strategy, including allowing a fire to burn
77	with limited or modified suppression, if the division determines that the strategy is appropriate
