MOTION: Rep. Peterson moved to approve the minutes of the February 12, 2013 meeting.

H.B. 126 Off-highway Vehicle User Fee Amendments (*Rep. S. Cox*)

Rep. Cox introduced the bill to the committee.

Spoke in favor of the bill: Chris Haller, Utah State Parks and Recreation

MOTION: Rep. Peterson moved to Pass H.B. 126 out favorably. The motion passed

unanimously with Rep. Pitcher and Rep. Sanpei absent for the vote.

H.B. 210 Motor Vehicle Emission Amendments (Rep. E. Redd)

Rep. Redd introduced the bill to the committee.

MOTION: Rep. Sanpei moved to amend the bill as follows:

H.B. 128 Driver License Suspension Modifications (Rep. D. Sagers)

Rep. Sagers introduced the bill to the committee.

MOTION: Rep. Knotwell moved to amend the bill as follows:

- 1. Page 12, Lines 347 through 348:
 - 347 (ii) if the person is [19 years of age or older but] under 21 years of age at the time of
 - 348 arrest and the arrest was made on or after { July 1, [2009] 2013 } May 14, 2013 :
- 2. Page 13, Line 383:
 - 383 (iii) prior to { July 1, 2013 } May 14, 2013 , for an offense that was committed prior to { July 1, 2013 } May 14, 2013 .
- 3. Page 16, Lines 490 through 492:
 - 490 [(i)] (a) deny the person's license until the person complies with Subsection (11)(b)(i)
 - but for a period of not less than six months beginning on the 30th day after the date of arrest for
 - a first offense under Subsection (2)(a) committed on or after { July 1, [2009] 2013 } May 14, 2013 ;
- 4. Page 18, Lines 540 through 541:
 - 540 (iii) prior to { July 1, 2013 } May 14, 2013 , for a violation under Subsection

(2)(a) that was committed

H.B. 127 Motor Vehicle Event Data Recorders (Rep. D. Lifferth)

Rep. Lifferth introduced the bill to the committee.

MOTION: Rep. McCay moved to amend the bill as follows:

- 1. Page 1, Lines 9 through 10:
 - 9 This bill modifies the {Traffic Code} Motor Vehicle Act by enacting provisions relating to event data
 - 10 recorders in motor vehicles.
- 2. *Page 2, Lines 28 through 37:*
 - 28 the data may be stored and transmitted $\{ \div \}$
 - 29 {-- provides that event data on a motor vehicle event data recorder does not become the
 - 30 property of the lienholder or insurer solely because the lienholder or insurer
 - 31 succeeds in ownership of a motor vehicle as a result of an accident;
 - 32 provides that an insurer may not condition the payment or settlement of an owner's
 - 33 claim on the owner's consent to the retrieval or use of the event data on a motor
 - 34 vehicle event data recorder; and
 - 35 provides that an insurer or lessor of a motor vehicle may not require an owner to
 - 36 consent to the retrieval or use of the data on a motor vehicle event data recorder as a
 - 37 condition of providing the policy or lease.
- 3. Page 2, Line 47:

- 47 { 41-1a-1504, Utah Code Annotated 1953 }
- 4. *Page 3, Lines 84 through 85:*
 - 84 (b) If a motor vehicle is owned by more than one person, all owners

 must only one owner is required to consent to
 - 85 the retrieval or use of the data from a motor vehicle event data recorder.
- 5. Page 5, Lines 122 through 131:
 - 122 { Section 4. Section 41-1a-1504 is enacted to read:
 - 123 <u>41-1a-1504.</u> Effect of ownership transfer on ownership of data.
 - 124 <u>(1) Event data on a motor vehicle event data recorder does not become the property of</u>
 - the lienholder or insurer solely because the lienholder or insurer succeeds in ownership of a
 - 126 motor vehicle as a result of an accident.
 - 127 (2) An insurer may not condition the payment or settlement of an owner's claim on the
 - 128 <u>owner's consent to the retrieval or use of the event data on a motor vehicle event data</u> <u>recorder.</u>
 - 129 (3) An insurer or lessor of a motor vehicle may not require an owner to consent to the
 - 130 <u>retrieval or use of the data on a motor vehicle event data recorder as a condition of providing</u>
 - 131 the policy or lease.

The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Peterson absent for the vote.

Spoke in favor of the bill: Chris Purcell, State Farm Insurance

MOTION: Rep. Fisher moved to pass H.B. 127 out favorably as amended. The motion passed unanimously.

MOTION: Rep. Lifferth moved to place the bill on the Consent Calendar. The motion failed.
