1st Substitute H.B. 58, Protection of Athletes with Head Injuries Act Amendments (P. Ray)

H.B. 276 Newborn Screening for Critical Congenital Heart Defects (*P. Ray*)

- 3. Page 7, Lines 195 through 205
- 195 31A-8a-205.5. {Rescission} Free look right.
- 196 (1) Except as provided in Subsection (2), a person that purchases a health <u>discount</u>
- 197 program may, with or without cause, within $\{-10\}$ *30* days after the day on which the purchase
- 198 contract is signed, cancel the contract without payment, damages, penalty, or liability
- 199 kind by giving written notice of cancellation to the other party to the contract.
- 200 (2) A person may not exercise the right of cancellation described in Subsection (1) if
- the person has used the services of the health discount program under the contract. 201
- (3) If a person cancels a contract under Subsection (1), the other party to the 202 contract
- 203 shall refund all money and other consideration paid in relation to the health discount program, less a maximum of \$25 of
- {-including-} any enrollment charge, regardless of whether the enrollment charge 204 was designated
- 205 as nonrefundable.
