	(a) Bill of Rights Day, on December 15;		
	(b) Constitution Day, on September 17;		
	(c) Yellow Ribbon Day, on the third Monday in May, in honor of men and women who		
8	are serving or have served in the U.S. armed forces around the world in defense of freedom;		
	(d) POW/MIA Recognition Day, on the third Friday in September;		
	(e) Indigenous People Day, the Monday immediately preceding Thanksgiving; [and]		
	(f) Utah State Flag Day, on March 9[-]; and		
	(g) Vietnam Veterans Recognition Day, on March 29.		
	(2) The Department of Veterans' and Military Affairs shall coordinate activities, special		
ľ	programs, and promotional information to heighten public awareness and involvement relating		
to Subsections (1)(c) and (d).			
	(3) The month of October shall be commemorated yearly as Italian-American Heritage

58	recognize the importance of water conservation, quality, and supply in the state.
