LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill modifies Title 58, Chapter 53, Landscape Architects Licensing Act, regarding the requirements for obtaining licensure in landscape architecture.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

▶ modifies the requirements for obtaining licensure in landscape architecture by removing the requirement for an applicant to:

- have a bachelor's or master's degree; or
- have completed supervised practical experience; and

▶ makes technical changes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **58-53-302** is amended to read:
