Section 1. Section <b>78A-7-203</b> is amended to read:
78A-7-203. Term of office for justice court judge Retention.
(1) The term of a justice court judge is $[six]$ four years beginning the first Monday in
January following the date of election.
(2) Upon the expiration of a justice court judge's term of office, the judge shall be
subject to an unopposed retention election in accordance with the procedures set forth in
