	Section 1. Section <b>53A-1-710</b> is enacted to read:
	53A-1-710. Grants for digital textbooks.
	(1) As used in this section "hardware" means:
	(a) personal mobile devices; and
	(b) desktop or laptop computers.
	(2) (a) The State Board of Education shall award grants to a school district or charter
scho	ool to facilitate the adoption of digital textbooks.
	(b) A school district or charter school that receives a grant under Subsection (2)(a) may
use	the grant for:
	(i) digital textbooks;
	(ii) hardware;
	(iii) professional development for educators related to the use of the technology
desc	eribed in Subsections (2)(b)(i) and (ii); or
	(iv) peripherals or networking equipment, including a wireless network.
	(3) (a) The State Board of Education shall solicit proposals from school districts and
char	ter schools for the use of the grant to facilitate the adoption of digital textbooks.
	(b) In awarding a grant under Subsection (2), the State Board of Education shall
cons	sider the applicant's capacity to use the grant to serve the greatest number of students
poss	sible.
	(4) The State Board of Education may not award a grant under Subsection (2) that
exce	eeds \$500 per student for the purchase of digital textbooks and hardware.
	(5) (a) The State Board of Education shall report annually to the Public Education
