 - 88 (8) If Subsection (7)(d)(v)(A) or (B) is met and a $\{\frac{\text{stay-at-home}}{\text{parent}}\}$ parent $\{\frac{\text{applies for}}{\text{parent}}\}$
 - 89 <u>assistance under Title 35A, Chapter 3, Employment Support Program,</u> <u>or the child</u> <u>becomes subject to the care and custody of the state,</u> <u>income may be</u>
 - 90 { <u>automatically</u> } imputed at the federal minimum wage for a 40-hour work week to { <u>that</u> } <u>either</u> parent. A
 - 91 payor parent's alimony obligation may not be reduced by { this imputation.
