H.B. 68 Protection of State Park Resources (Rep. D. Pitcher)

Rep. Pitcher explained the bill to the committee with the assistance of Jeff Rasmussen, deputy director, Utah State Parks.

MOTION: Rep. Handy moved to amend the bill as follows:

- 1. Page 3, Lines 73 through 76:
 - 73 {<u>(c) If an individual has already been convicted of a crime described in Subsection (2)</u>,
 - 74 each subsequent conviction shall be punishable as one degree higher than provided in
 - 75 Subsection (3)(b).

1st Sub. H.B. 225 Primary Law Enforcement Duties for Sheriffs (Rep. P. Ray)

MOTION: Rep. Ivory moved to pass the bill out favorably. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Brown, Rep. Edwards, Rep. Mathis, and Rep. Wilcox absent for the vote.

MOTION: Rep. Ivory moved to amend the bill as follows:

- 6. *Page 2, Lines 38 through 39:*
 - 38 (2) The state veterinarian may not { engage } receive compensation for services provided while engaging in the private practice of veterinary
 - 39 medicine.

(3) The state veterinarian shall be a veterinarian licensed under Title 58, Chapter 28, Veterinary Practice Act.

Rep. Barrus moved to pass the bill out favorably as amended. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Brown, Rep. Draxler, Rep. Edwards, Rep. Mathis, Rep. Sagers, and Rep. Wilcox absent for the vote.

H.B. 67 Political Subdivision Jurisdiction Amendments (Rep. M. Roberts)

This bill was not heard.

MOTION: Rep. McKell moved to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Brown, Rep. Draxler, Rep. Edwards, Rep. Mathis, Rep. Sagers, and Rep. Wilcox absent for the vote.
