39-1-54. Privilege from arrest or citation Exceptions.
(1) [The members] A member of the National Guard [are] is privileged from arrest or
citation by civil authorities [during their attendance at drill parades or encampments, or in
going to and returning from any of these activities.]:
(a) during military formations, exercises, mobilizations, or other duty when exigent,
perilous, emergency, or similar circumstances require the member $\hat{H} \rightarrow \underline{!} \leftarrow \hat{H}$ s presence; and
(b) while traveling to and from military duty locations when exigent, perilous,
emergency, or similar circumstances require the member $\hat{H} \rightarrow \underline{!} \leftarrow \hat{H}$ s presence.
(2) This privilege does not extend to arrest or citation for:
(a) treason;
(b) any $\hat{H} \rightarrow \underline{\text{class A misdemeanor or}} \leftarrow \hat{H}$ felony;
(c) breach of the peace; <u>or</u>
(d) operation of a vehicle in a reckless manner or while under the influence of any drug
or alcohol[ <del>; or</del> ].
[(e) offenses which under state law are class A misdemeanors or greater.]
