(1) (a) [The] Beginning on J	une 28, 2008, and ending on December 31, 2016, the
Legislature fixes salaries for the con	stitutional offices as follows:

[(b)] (ii) lieutenant governor	:: 95% of the governor's salary;
[(c)] (iii) attorney general:	95% of the governor's salary;
