#### **General Description:**

This bill creates the Voter Participation Task Force.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:* 

Section 1. Voter Participation Task Force -- Creation and membership -- Interim rules followed -- Compensation -- Staff.

- (1) There is created the Voter Participation Task Force consisting of the following nine members:
- (a) four members of the Senate, appointed by the president of the Senate, no more than three of whom may be from the same political party; and
- (b) five members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the speaker of the House of Representatives, no more than three of whom may be from the same political party.
- (2) (a) The president of the Senate shall appoint one of the task force members from the Senate as cochair of the task force.
- (b) The speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one of the task force members from the House of Representatives as cochair of the task force.

- (3) Salaries and expenses of the members of the task force shall be paid in accordance with Section 36-2-2 and Legislative Joint Rules, Title 5, Chapter 3, Legislator Compensation.
- (4) The task force shall comply with the legislative interim rules in conducting the task force's business.
- (5) The Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel shall provide staff support to the task force.
