(1) The division shall create a:



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28	(a) public awareness campaign, in consultation with representatives of the solid fuel
29	burning industry, on best wood burning practices and the effects of wood burning on air
30	quality, specifically targeting nonattainment areas; [and]
31	(b) program to assist an individual to convert a dwelling to a natural gas [or other clean
32	fuel], propane, or wood pellet heating source or a wood burning stove certified by the United
33	States Environmental Protection Agency, as funding allows, if the individual:
34	(i) lives in a dwelling where a wood burning stove is the sole source of heat; and
35	(ii) is on the list of registered sole heating source homes[-]; and
36	(c) solid fuel burning program for a nonattainment area, as described in Subsection (2).
