3	only, and will not be paid with federal funds;

6	state of Utah;
7	WHEREAS, the relocation of the Utah state prison has the potential to employ a
8	substantial number of workers, both in the relocation itself and in any indirect economic
9	development opportunities that may arise from the prison's relocation; and
